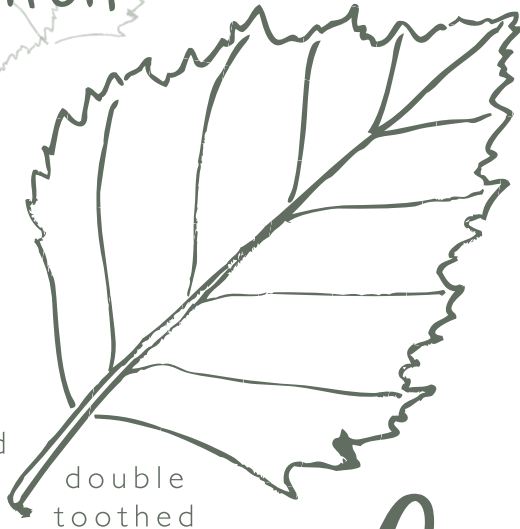


SILVER BIRCH

brown with small bumps or warts



winged seeds are 1-2mm long and are released from the fruits

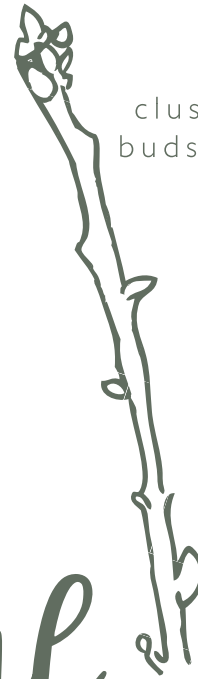


double toothed edges

ENGLISH OAK

cluster of buds at the tip

three to six rounded lobes on each side



acorns sit in cups at the end of long stalks

leaf IDENTIFYER

WALNUT

thick with a leathery surface

five to nine leaflets

an edible nut is inside the tough outer casing

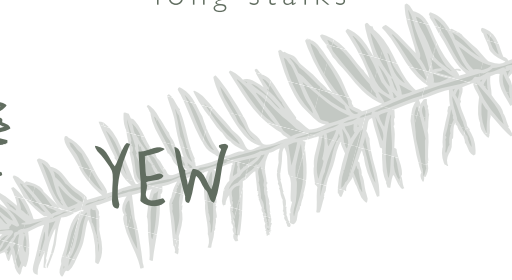
hollow inside



YEW

needle-like leaves are narrow, flat and dark green

red berry like fruits, called arils



SYCAMORE



green buds
grow in
opposite pairs



winged fruits
called keys, are green
at first then
ripen to brown



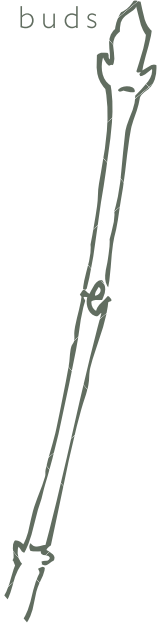
HORSE CHESTNUT



one conker
inside each spiky
green fruit



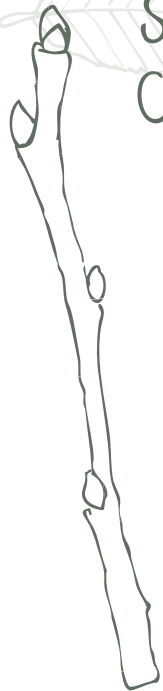
sticky

edges

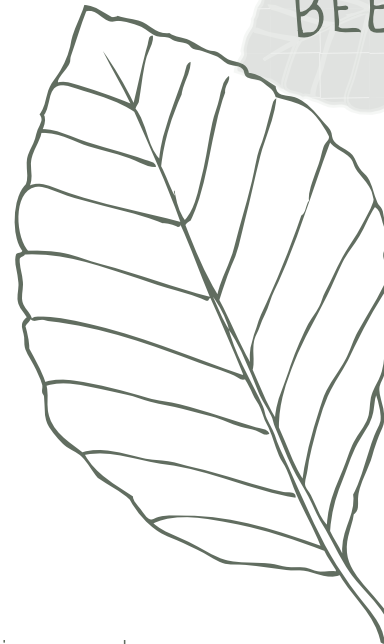


fruits open to reveal
