
Olibernating Manimally

When the rest of the bumblebee colony dies at the end of summer, queen bumblebees do something more associated with hedgehogs — they hibernate.



Hibernation is a prolonged period of inactivity that allows animals to survive when food is scarce and the weather is harsh



Animals don't dream during hibernation.

During their long winter sleep,
an animal's body is too cold
to produce the electric currents
related to dreaming.

In the UK, only three mammal groups truly hibernate.
All of our bat species, hedgehogs and dormice retreat to their toastie little homes from around October/November to March/April the following year.

HEDGEHOG

Hibernation is when an animal slows its heart rate to save energy and survive the winter without eating much.

Some animals just slow down and move less frequently during hibernation, but others go into a deep sleep and don't wake up till spring.
